

Colonel Cooke was born in Melbourne and schooled at Mentone Boys Grammar School. Is a qualified Music Teacher through the Australian Music Education Board, studied at Monash University for an Arts/Music degree and joined the Army Reserve in 1982.



He graduated Dux in 1987 into the Intelligence Corps and posted to 2nd/15th Field Regiment before transferring to Artillery. Has held all key positions within Artillery and was the Commanding Officer of 2/10 Fd Regt at the time 2nd Division artillery units were converting to mortars.

Colonel Cooke has served overseas on exercises, held key appointments as Chief Instructor, Chief of Staff 4th Brigade, SO1 Reform, Assistant Commander 4th BDE.
