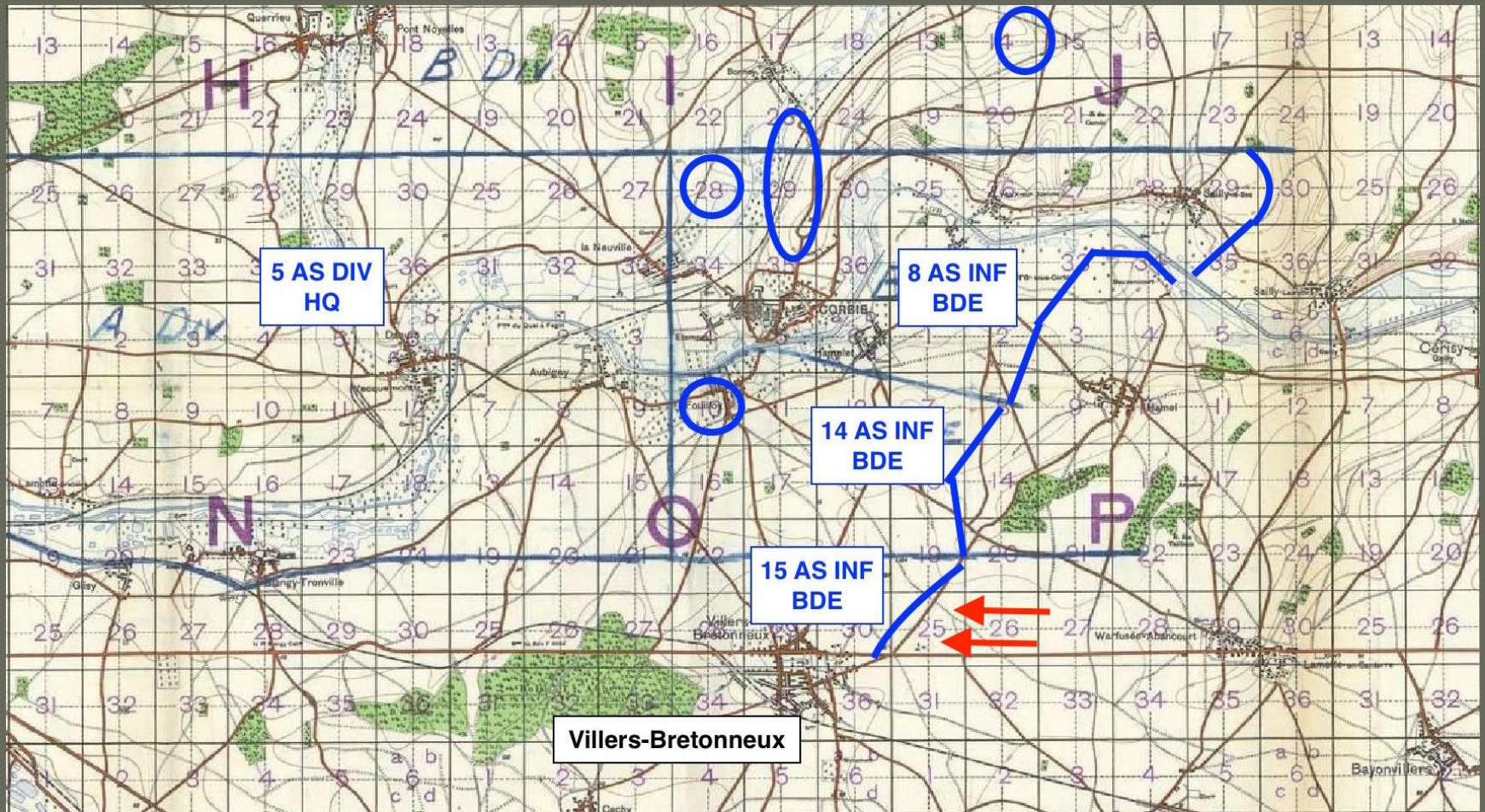
Plan: 24/25 April 1918
